**“I’ll be with you always”
Now that’s a Promise**

There are many compelling reasons to be a Christian. There is the ultimate gift that God offered. “For God so loved the world, that He gave His only begotten Son, that whosoever believeth in Him should not perish, but have everlasting life” (John 3:16). The blood bought institution, the Church, which God has provided for His children is another. “Take heed therefore unto yourselves, and to all the flock, over the which the Holy Ghost hath made you overseers, to feed the church of God, which he hath purchased with his own blood” (Acts 20:28). Christ even spoke of the drawing power of the cross, “And I, if I be lifted up from the earth, will draw all men unto me” (John 12:32). For myself, quite possibly, the most compelling reason is Christ’s promise, “And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you always, even unto the end of the world. Amen” (Matthew 28:18-20). Let’s read that once more, Christ said, “I will be with you”! You can ALWAYS count on Christ. During difficulties, trails, sorrow and happiness, He is always there. Aren’t you thankful as a Christian that Christ has promised to be with you!

Death, disease, and divorce are just a few of the difficulties that we may face. One of the most difficult things to do is to try to comfort someone who has lost a loved one. Don’t you feel like your words and actions are inadequate? Christ offers them true comfort. Paul told the church at Thessalonica to, “Wherefore comfort one another with these words” (1 Thessalonians 4:18). These were not just any words, but these words were the sentiment of the Savior! Do you feel alone, deserted, helpless, and don’t know where to turn? I can point you to the one who has the answers. It is the one on the Cross! Please, don’t make the mistake that many do during difficult times. Many turn away from God instead of turning to God. Christ says, “Come unto me, all ye that labour and are heavy laden, and I will give you rest” (Matthew 11:28).

When we stare through the eyes of hopelessness, Christ is there! In this economic crisis many wonder how they will pay the electric bill, put food on the table, and have gas to go to work. How much more difficult would it be to face these problems alone? Christ never promised riches, but he has promised to be with us during hard times. What a blessing it is to have a Church family to help me through these times of hopelessness. Along with the knowledge that Christ is with us, there is nothing like the support we receive from our Christian friends. A kind word, a cold drink, a phone call, a visit, or even a card to let someone know we are thinking about him or her. We see Biblical examples of Christians helping others (cf. Acts 2:44,45), let us lend a hand also.

When the trials of life come, I am so thankful, I can count on Christ. Have you lost that relationship? You can have it back. “If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just to forgive us our sins, and to cleanse us from all unrighteousness” (1 John 1:9). Now that’s a Promise!
