Growing Old

What is it about age that dominates so much of our thinking? There is not much, if anything, that we think or talk about any more than growing old. The young can't wait until they get older, and those who are older want to be younger. My four year old granddaughter, Briana, said the other day, "When I grow up I am going to be a teenager." Time moves ever so slowly for the young and so rapidly for the older crowd. As a youngster I can recall how much I anticipated my sixteenth birthday so I could get a driver's license. The years moved at a snail's pace during the early years of my life. When we get into the "golden" years of life, we begin to understand, "But, beloved, be not ignorant of this one thing, that one day *is* with the Lord as a thousand years, and a thousand years as one day" (II Pet. 3:8).

It is a strange thing about age, when in the early years, we want to count not only every year, but half years are also very important. How many time have you been corrected about the age of your youngster, they are not seven, but seven and a half. It is important! On the other hand, as you cross the line to adult hood (post teen) you are not about to tally half years, in fact you want to hold on to the previous year. Our daughter is getting weary holding on to her twenty-ninth year. I am the youngest in my family, however in the last few years, my siblings would have you to believe I am the "oldest". Perhaps my gray hair helps them sell the idea.

The fact about growing old is, we will grow old or we will die young. As the saying goes, "Growing old is not so bad when you consider the alternative." Getting old is not a bad thing. In fact there are many advantages to age. People give you a break concerning your behavior, people speak louder, so you can hear, and they will do things for you because they take for granted you are too old to do it for yourself. The Bible has something to say about the elderly, "The hoary head *is* a crown of glory, *if* it be found in the way of righteousness" (Proverbs 16:31). We tend to put the "old folks" on the shelf and replace them with youth. The church is concerned about keeping young people involved with all kinds of programs for youth (and we should) but we seldom see programs or activities for the elderly. Just because some one has aged doesn't mean they have out lived their usefulness.

Noah was over five hundred years old when he built the ark (Gen. 5,6). Moses was eighty years old when he went down to Egypt to deliver the children of Israel from bondage. Many times our best work is done after our hair turns gray.
